Vaccinated Outside Your Home Province/Territory, or Canada? No Problem! Here's How To Update Your Local Records*

As COVID-19 numbers continue to drop across Canada, there is increasing optimism that provinces, territories and borders will "open up". In this "open" environment, an individual's vaccination status may become highly relevant, and it will be imperative to ensure this information is up-to-date, accurate and accessible.

The attached briefing note outlines the steps an individual can take to update their records if they received one or more doses of the COVID-19 vaccine outside their home province, territory, or Canada.

Jurisdiction	How to Update
British Columbia	An individual who has received one or more doses of the COVID-19 vaccine outside of British Columbia, can update their vaccination status in the provincial immunization registry. How to update 1. Register with the Get Vaccinated system. This can be done: a. Online (need a Personal Health Number) b. By phone at 1-833-838-2323. Provide the following information: • Name • Date of vaccination • Vaccine product/type • Personal Health Number • Contact Information • Postal Code c. In person at a Service BC Office
	2. Submit proof of an official vaccination record to be entered in the Provincial Immunization Registry.

An individual who has received one or more doses of the COVID-19 vaccine outside of Alberta, can update their vaccination status in the provincial health system. How to update There are two ways to update your vaccination status: Provide information to Alberta Health Services: 1. Drop a copy of your immunization record at an AHS public health clinic. 2. The AHS public health clinic will manually enter your vaccination record into the provincial health records system. Alberta Provide information when receiving second dose: 1. An individual who has received their first dose outside of Alberta can receive their second dose when they become eligible. 2. Bring a record of your first dose to the clinic. 3. When you receive your second dose, your first dose will be manually entered into the provincial system. Present your vaccination record to your local public health office. 2. Alternatively, submit your vaccination record to:

Quebec	An individual who has received one or more doses of the COVID-19 vaccine outside of Quebec can update their vaccination status in the Quebec Vaccination Registry. How to update 1. Access the Clic Santé portal online and book an appointment at one of the designated regional vaccination centres for people who were vaccinated outside Quebec. 2. Choose from the available list of centres. 3. Present legal identification and proof of vaccination from the country where you have been vaccinated. 4. If the information is acceptable, your vaccination status will be updated and an electronic proof of your vaccination record will be sent to you. Guidelines to receive proof of vaccination are online at the Government of Quebec's website. New Brunswick	An individual who has received one or more doses of the COVID-19 vaccine outside of New Brunswick can update their vaccination status. How to update 1. Register with the New Brunswick Travel Registration Program online at: https://www2.gnb.ca/content/gnb/en/corporate/promo/travel-registration.html#howtoregister 2. You will receive a questionnaire from Public Health confirming you received a COVID vaccine while outside the province. 3. Submit the questionnaire to Public Health and your immunization record will be updated. 4. If you do not receive a questionnaire from Public Health, contact your local Public Health Office. Northwest Territories	An individual who has received a dose of the COVID-19 vaccine outside of Northwest Territories can update their vaccination status. How to update 1. Register for a second dose when eligible. 2. Bring proof/record of vaccination when you receive your second dose. 3. Yukon	An individual who has received a dose of the COVID-19 vaccine outside of the territory can update their vaccine status. How to update 1. Register for second dose when eligible. This can be done through Yukon's online portal or by calling the COVID Infoline at 1-877-374-0425. 2. Bring your Yukon health care card, or valid photo identification, and proof of vaccination to your appointment.
